

## SESSION APPROVED COVID-19/Delta Variant GAMEPLAN for FALL 2021

**Goal:** Realizing what I do affects you – we try to keep one another safe.

*The CDC County Covid tracker noted above has Hunterdon County at HIGH transmission. Therefore, we went to requiring masks for all indoors for in-person worship on Aug 22, 2021.*

If the nj.gov transmission levels move to HIGH (orange) in the fall and show a continuing pattern, Session may decide via email to close all in-person activities until such a time as it returns to MODERATE (yellow). This would affect Worship, Sunday school, in-person meetings, fellowship, and outside groups.

**If the nj.gov transmission levels remain at MODERATE (yellow), in the fall we will:**

**Worship** – Offer in-person worship with masks, social distancing, and hygiene protocols.

\*Resume choirs and bell choirs with masks and social distancing and hygiene protocols.

\*Resume congregational singing with masks and social distancing and hygiene protocols.

**Sunday School** – offer in-person Sunday school with masks (for ages 3 and up), social distancing, and hygiene protocols.

**In person meetings/fellowship** – with masks indoors, social distancing and hygiene protocols and encouraging outside when possible. If indoors, then no food or drink.

**Sept 12 Picnic** – will be outside, ok to serve food making sure that everything offered with serving spoons – no touching food. If it rains, then cancel it.

**Outside groups** – with masks indoors, social distancing, and hygiene protocols.

**If the nj.gov transmission levels are at MODERATE or LOW and the CDC/NJ lifts indoor mask recommendations, in the fall we will resume:**

Worship without requiring masks for those who are vaccinated.

Sunday School without requiring masks.

In person meetings/fellowship without requiring masks for those who are vaccinated.

Outside groups without requiring masks for those who are vaccinated.
